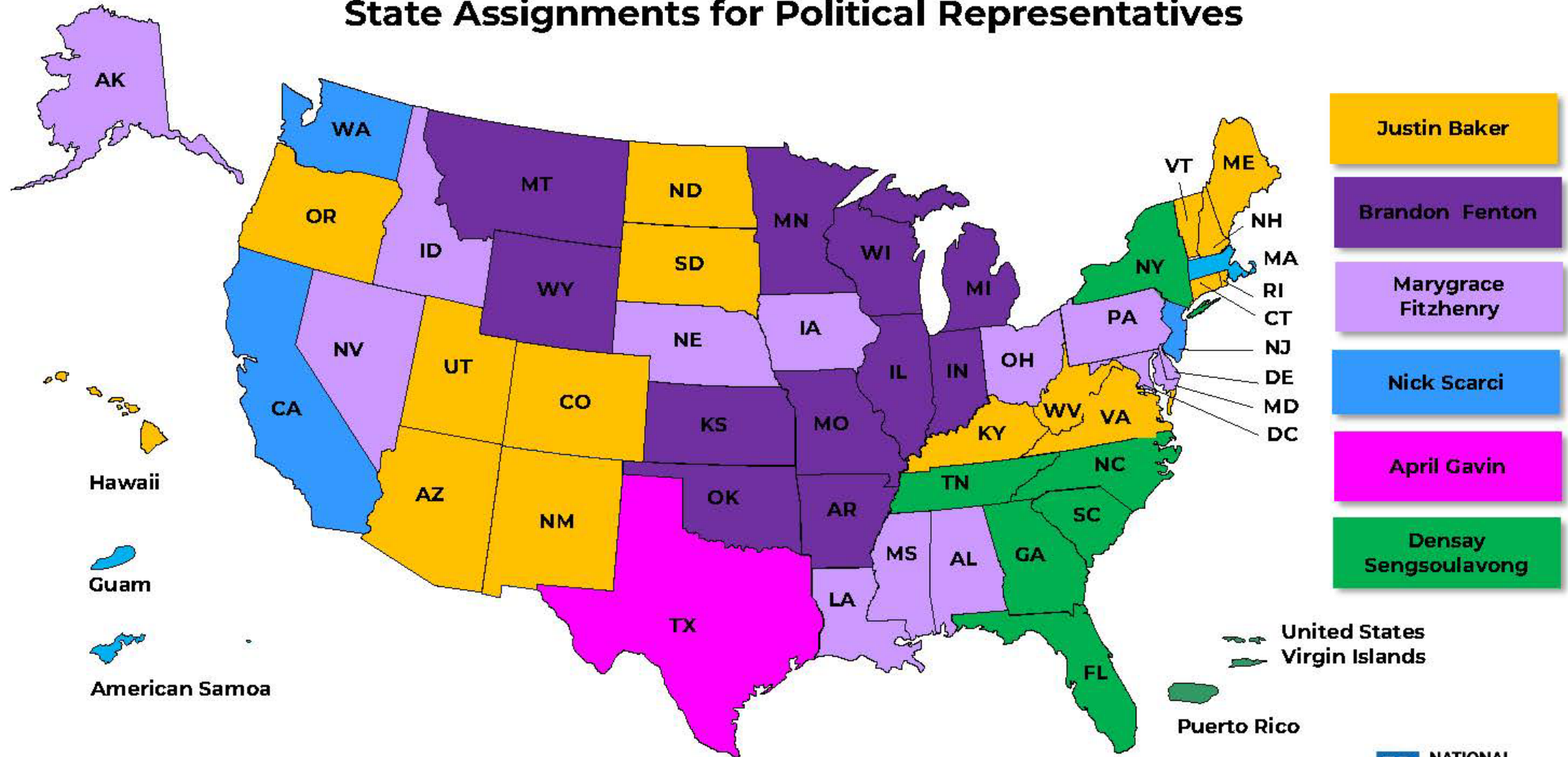

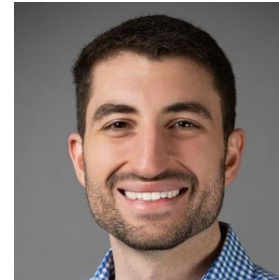

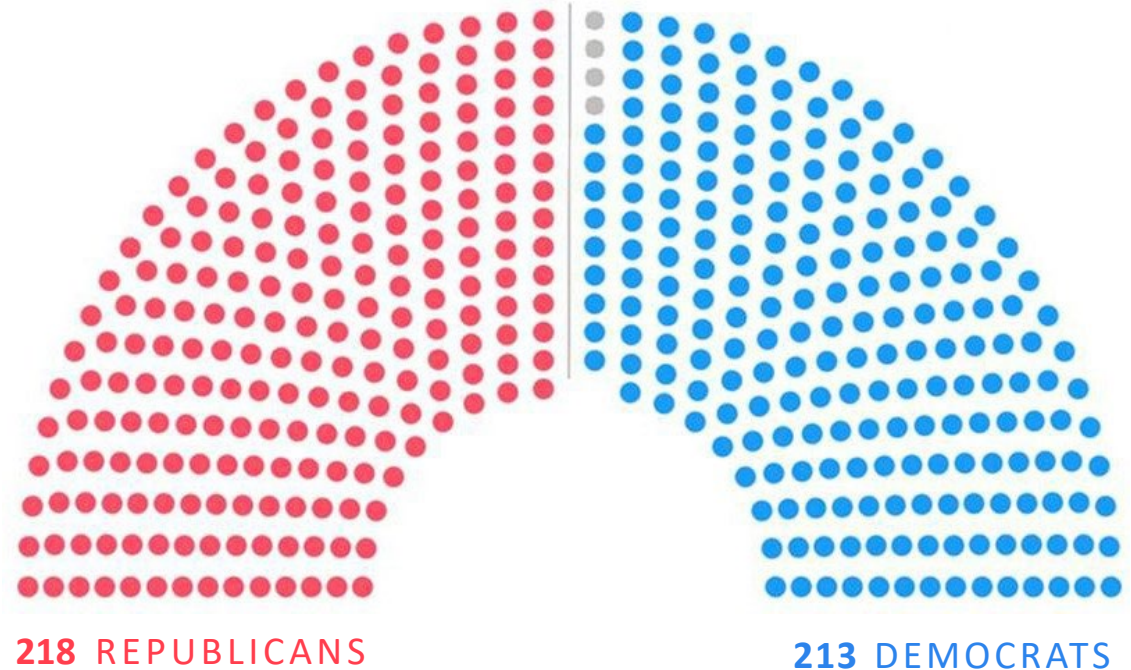

Republicans hold an advantage in upcoming redistricting battles

“ Vice President JD Vance traveled again to **Indiana** ... to **strongarm reluctant Republicans** to revisit their congressional map. **Kansas appears poised to carve up its lone Democratic seat** after Republicans approved a budget for a special session this fall that would target Rep. Sharice Davids’ (D-01) suburban Kansas City seat. Across the state line, **Missouri Republicans already redrew lines to further favor Republicans**, all but eliminating Rep. Emanuel Cleaver’s (D-05) seat.”

A REDISTRICTING ARMS RACE

- What began as a GOP effort to expand House control has recently become a **nationwide battle**, with both parties seeking to redraw maps ahead of 2026
- **Republicans continue to move faster** due to partisan control of key legislatures, while **Democrats rely on courts, amendments, and voter referenda to counter Republican efforts**

State redistricting highlights

INDIANA SENATE REJECTS NEW MAP

Twenty-one Republican state Senators joined all Democrats to oppose a new congressional map that would have given Republicans an advantage in an additional 2 districts in 2026



TEXAS CONGRESSIONAL MAP REINSTATED

The Supreme Court ruled in favor of Texas’s new congressional map after a federal panel ruled the map was likely racially gerrymandered; the new map will give Republicans an advantage in an additional 5 seats in the 2026 midterms



CALIFORNIA APPROVES PROP 50

California **approved Proposition 50**, which suspended the state’s independent redistricting commission and paved the way for the GOP delegation to risk losing up to 5 seats

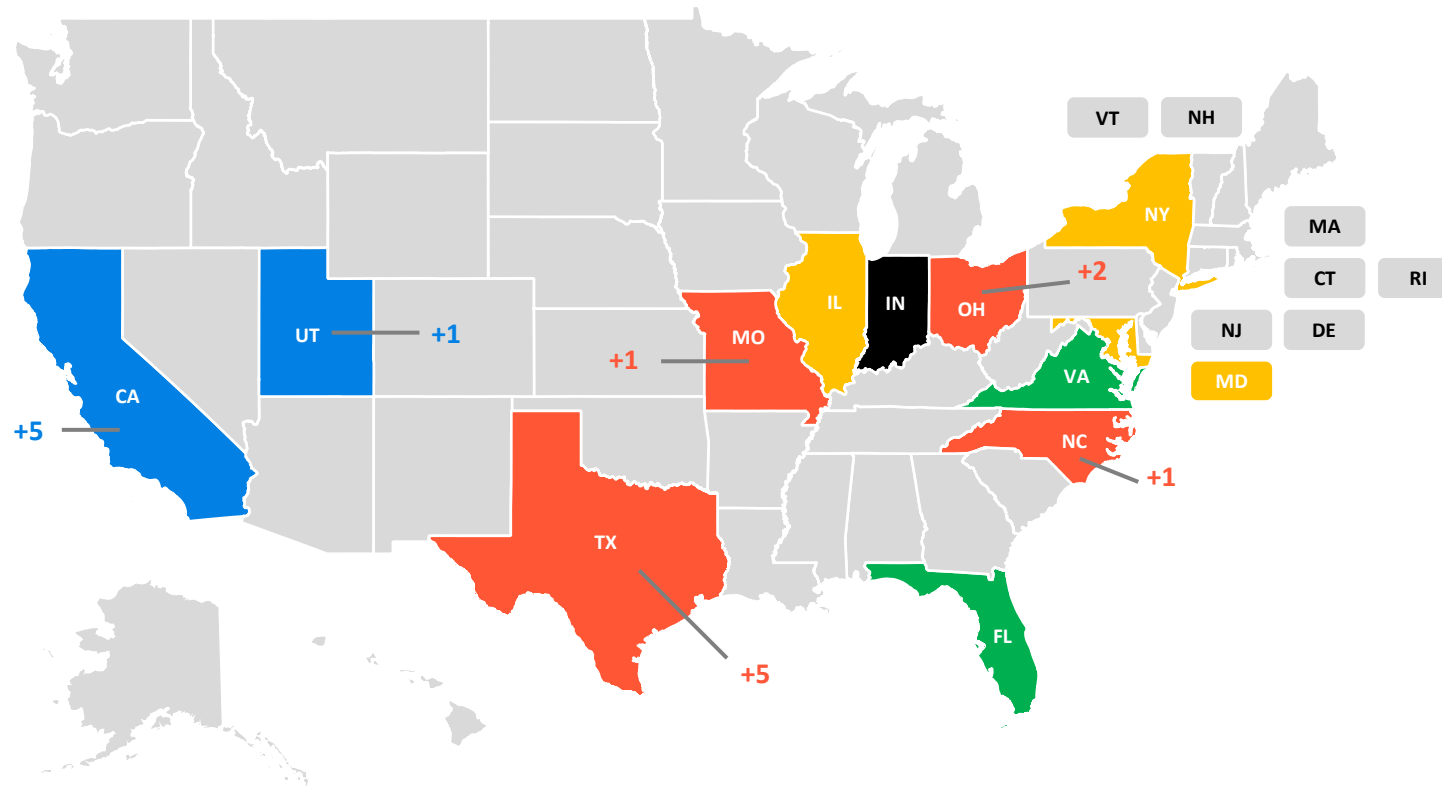

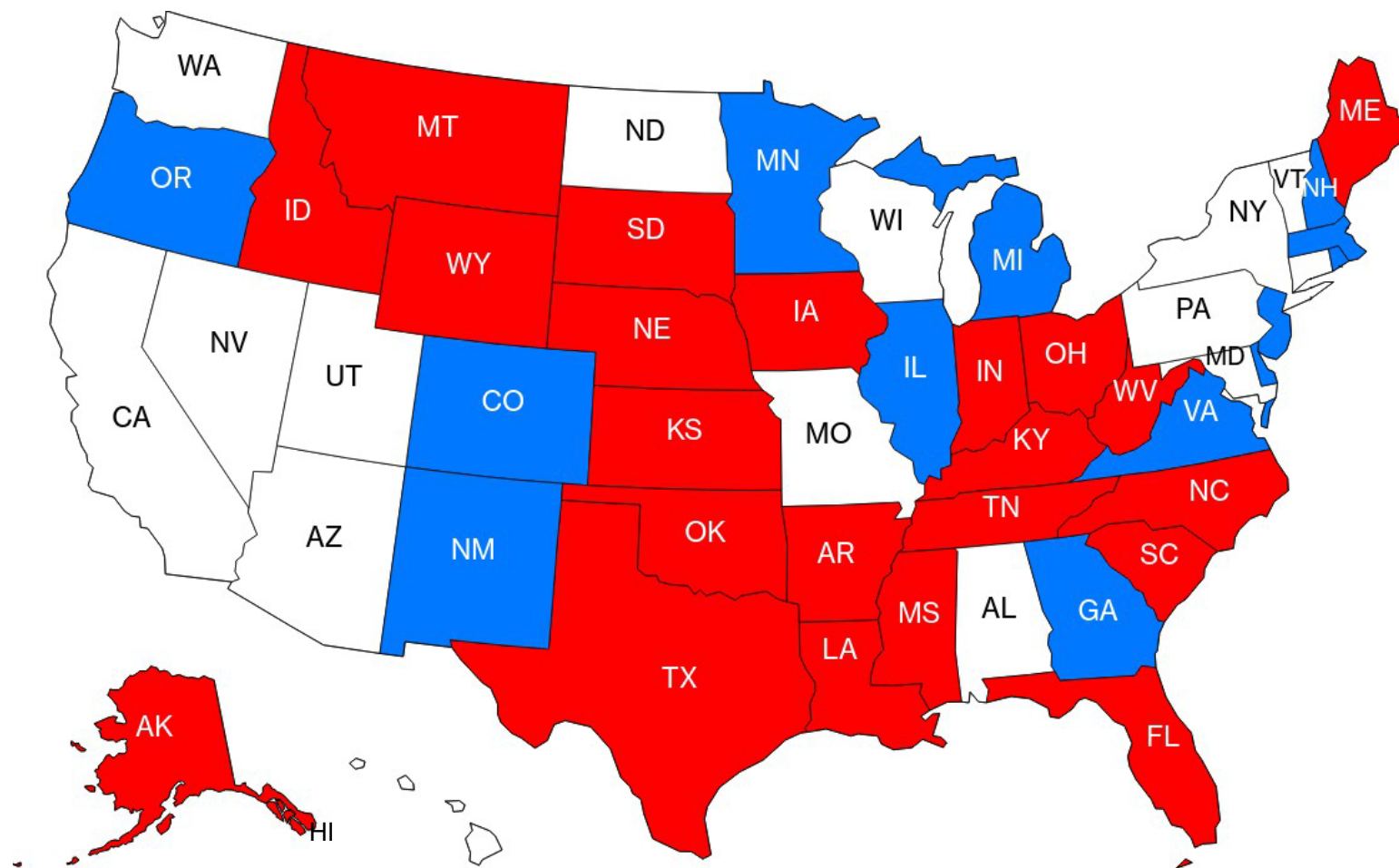

Recent Administrative Actions and Congressional Funding

- White House has announced a multiple housing initiatives in the last two weeks.
- House has been moving series of minibus funding packages that have been bipartisan while also reducing spending.



NAR Bills to Watch

ROAD to Housing Act

- Bipartisan comprehensive housing package sponsored by Chairman Tim Scott (R-SC) and Ranking Member Elizabeth Warren (D-MA)
- Addresses housing supply, affordability and homeownership pathways
- Would streamline permitting, expand infrastructure investment, and unlock new development
- Passed the Senate on 10/9/25
- **S. 2651**

Housing for the 21st Century Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Chairman French Hill (R-AR) and Ranking Member Maxine Waters (D-CA)
- Reported favorably out of Financial Services Committee on 12/17/25
- Would streamline housing production and affordability by modernizing outdated housing programs, reducing regulatory barriers, and increasing flexibility for local communities
- **H.R. 6644**

More Homes on the Market Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Jimmy Panetta (D-CA), Rep. Mike Kelly (R-PA) and Sen. John Cornyn (R-TX) and Sen. Michael Bennet (D-CO)
- Would decrease the equity penalty on sale of primary residence and incentivizes more long-term owners to sell homes
- **H.R. 1340 / S. 3332**

Saving the American Dream Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by the four co-chairs of the bipartisan Real Estate Caucus
- Would tackle housing affordability by creating an interagency task force to coordinate data and policies
- **H.R. 5387**

NAR Bills to Watch

Neighborhood Homes Investment Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Mike Kelly (R-PA) and Rep. John Larson (D-CT) and Sen. Mark Warner (D-VA) and Sen. Todd Young (R-IN)
- Would revitalize distressed neighborhoods by creating a new federal tax credit for single-family housing
- **H.R. 2854 / S. 1686**

Uplifting First Time Homebuyers Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Beth Van Duyne (R-TX) and Rep. Julia Brownley (D-CA)
- Would increase the amount that can be withdrawn penalty-free from IRAs for a downpayment on a first-time home
- **H.R. 3526 / S. 2867**

Direct Seller and Real Estate Harmonization Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Kevin Kiley (R-CA) and Rep. Henry Cuellar (D-TX)
- Would ensure that real estate agents and direct sellers would maintain their independent contractor status under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA)
- **H.R. 3495**

Association Health Plans Act

- Bipartisan bill led by Chairman Tim Walberg (R-MI)
- Would expand health care choices for small businesses and self-employed individuals through association health plans (AHPs)
- **H.R. 2528 / S. 1847**

NAR Bills to Watch

Revitalizing Downtowns and Main Streets Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Mike Carey (R-OH) and Rep. Jimmy Gomez (D-CA)
- Would convert underused commercial properties into residential and mixed-use housing
- **H.R. 2410**

Fair and Equal Housing Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Brad Schneider (D-IL) and Rep. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA)
- Would add sexual orientation and gender identity as protected classes under the Fair Housing Act, codifying the application of the Supreme Court's Bostock v. Clayton County decision to the Fair Housing Act, to help ensure equal housing protections for all Americans
- **H.R. 3696**

Neighborhood Homes Investment Act

- Bipartisan bill sponsored by Rep. Mike Kelly (R-PA) and Rep. John Larson (D-CT) and Sen. Mark Warner (D-VA) and Sen. Todd Young (R-IN)
- Would revitalize distressed neighborhoods by creating a new federal tax credit for single-family housing
- **H.R. 2854 / S. 1686**
