

# HOW TO DISCUSS REALTORS® RELIEF FOUNDATION IMPACT IN CONGRESSIONAL MEETINGS



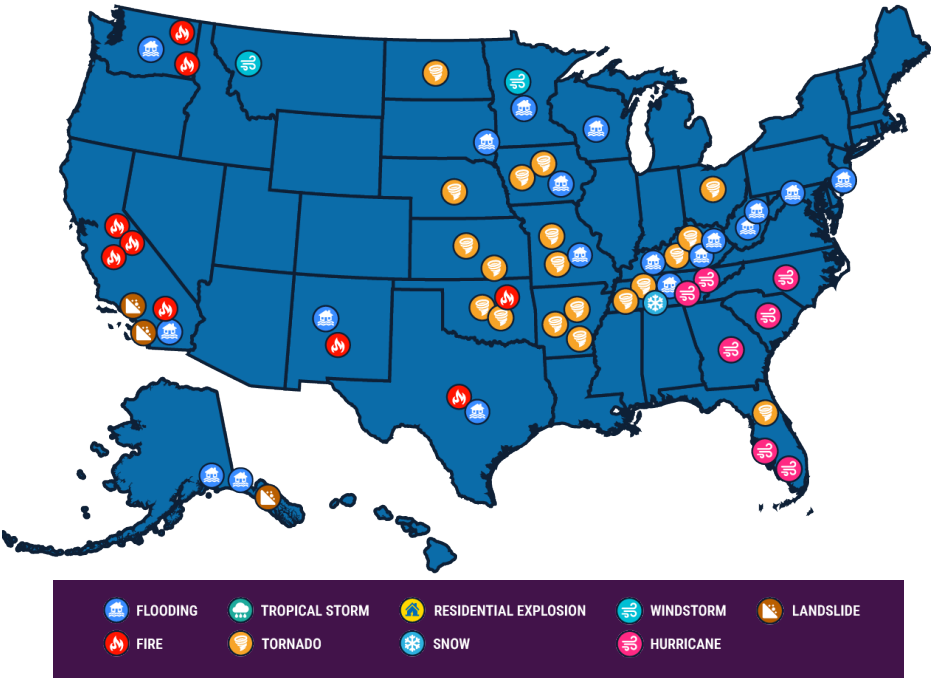
Federal Political Coordinators should be prepared to provide members of Congress with state-specific information related to the REALTORS® Relief Foundation (RRF). Prior to any congressional meeting, FPCs should have available a brief summary of RRF disaster-related activity in their state, as well as the number of REALTORS® who contribute to RRF and the total contribution amount from that state. When discussing RRF with a member of Congress, FPCs may use the following suggested language:

*"For over 20 years, the REALTORS® Relief Foundation has provided housing-related assistance to disaster-impacted communities, helping families recover and rebuild following natural disasters. REALTORS® in our state actively support this work through their contributions to RRF, which has provided assistance in communities affected by events such as tornadoes, floods, hurricanes, and wildfires. In [STATE], [X] REALTORS® have contributed \$[X] to support these disaster relief efforts."*

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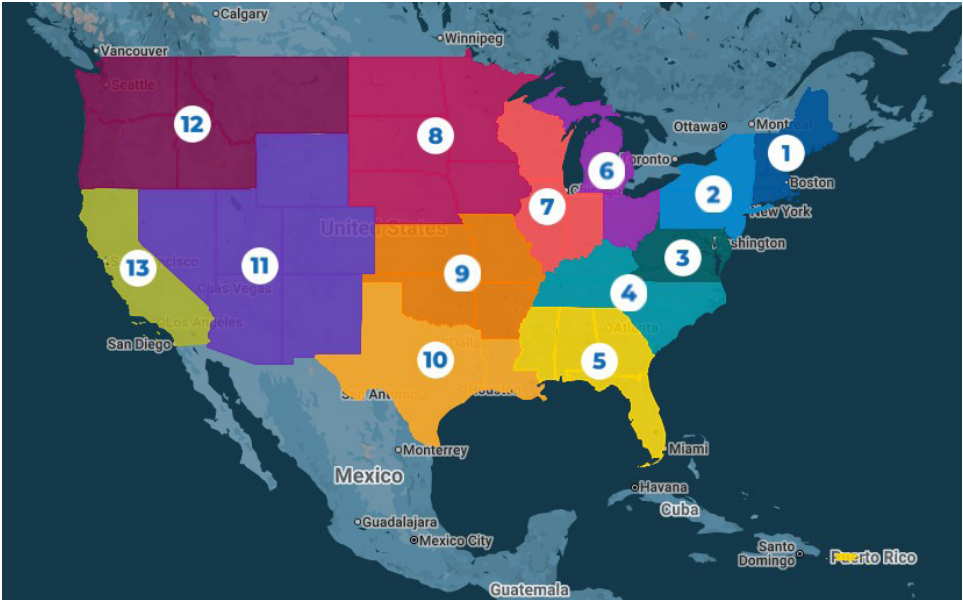
