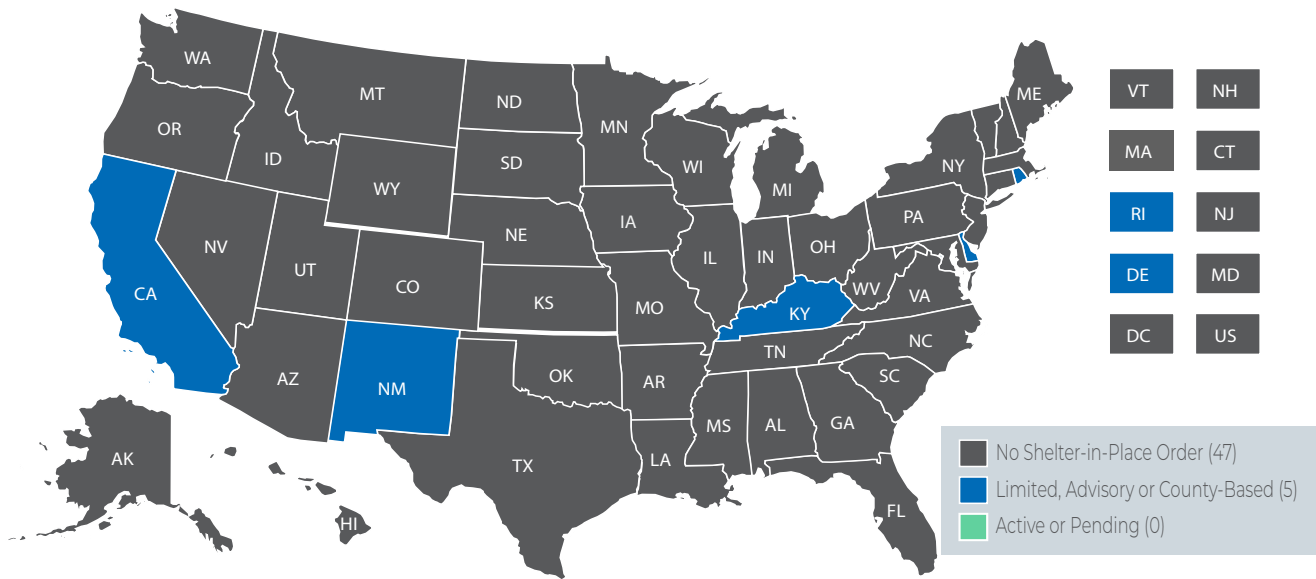


REAL ESTATE-RELATED SHELTER IN PLACE ORDERS

JUNE 3, 2021

Updates:

- **California's** business restrictions [will be lifted](#) June 15, pending low levels of hospitalization.
- The **District of Columbia** plans to [fully reopen](#) on June 11.
- **Kentucky** [will lift](#) restrictions beginning June 11.
- **Michigan** will [lift most restrictions](#) on July 1.
- **Oregon** will reopen [once 70 percent](#) of eligible persons have received at least one vaccine dose.
- **New Mexico's** Democratic Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham [announced](#) that once 60 percent of residents have been vaccinated, the state will remove most restrictions.

Montana	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Nebraska	No	No statewide closure mandate
Nevada	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
New Hampshire	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
New Jersey	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
New Mexico	Yes, county based	No (remote/online business may still be conducted)
New York	No	Yes; essential under previous order with restrictions
North Carolina	Expired	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
North Dakota	No	Yes; not deemed as “non-essential” under previous order
Ohio	Expired	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Oklahoma	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Oregon	Expired	No (real estate is still open; best practices must be followed)

State	Shelter-in-Place Order?	Does Order list Real Estate as an Essential Service?
Pennsylvania	Expired January 4	Yes; Real Estate may operate in-person if certain requirements are met
Rhode Island	Advisory	No; not listed as “essential” or “non-essential” under previous order
South Carolina	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
South Dakota	No	No statewide closure mandate
Tennessee	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Texas	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Utah	No	No; Real Estate not essential but remote operations may continue
Vermont	No	No; Real Estate not essential but remote operations may continue
Virginia	Expired	No; Real Estate not essential but remote and limited in-person operations may continue
Washington	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service, restrictions apply
West Virginia	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Wisconsin	No	Yes; previous order deemed Real Estate as an essential service
Wyoming	No	No; Real Estate not listed as essential or required to close
