Real estate transfer taxes are state and local taxes that are assessed on real property when ownership of the property is transferred between parties. Although proponents say real estate transfer taxes are necessary to help fund state services, opponents view them as an unwarranted tax on home sales.

Reducing or prohibiting transfer taxes on the sale of properties results in making home and property ownership more affordable for years to come—which are huge victories not only for REALTORS® but property owners, and communities.



Based on the budget projections over the next five years, the Municipality would need to increase the real estate transfer tax from its current rate of five-tenths of a percent to one percent.


