Virginia HB 1343 2022 - 2023 Del. Vivian Watts (D-VA-039)	Income Tax Conformity Taxation: Property Tax Amount Changes, Sales Tax on Professional Services	Taxation in the Commonwealth. Makes numerous changes to the Commonwealth's tax structure. The bill provides that the standard deduction for individual income taxes shall be set permanently at \$4,500 for individuals and \$9,000 for married persons. Under current law, the standard deduction is scheduled to revert to \$3,000 and \$6,000, respectively, beginning with taxable year 2026. Beginning with taxable year 2022, individual income tax brackets, the filing threshold, the amount of the standard deduction, and the amount of personal exemptions shall be adjusted on an annual basis in accordance with the yearly change in the Chained Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (C-CPI-U).	02/15/2022 - Left in Finance History
